You will be assigned (select) a character from Roman mythology.

Choose one of the following projects to complete using the research you complete about your character.

A. Bio Poem (The bio poem includes two parts.)

Part 1. Complete a "bio" poem for your character in the following format: (Make sure it's centered!)

Part 2. You must submit a brief explanation using evidence from myths to support your answers. (This must be in paragraph form.)

*Bio Poem and explanation must be typed. For the bio-poem, select your own font and size, but make sure it all fits on one page.

B. First Person Retelling of Myth

For this project, you will assume the role of your character, and retell a myth told from the character's perspective (using "I"). YOU ARE the CHARACTER.

Requirements:

- 1. You must "dress" the part.
- 2. Your retelling must include background information about the character and other characters in the story.
- 3. You must step into the character's shoes and BE the character for your presentation.
- 3. You must submit a written version of your re-telling 2 days before your performance.
 - Text evidence must be included in the written version of the retelling. You should NOT say this evidence when you are presenting your retelling, but it must be included in the written version.
 - Written version must be typed, double spaced, and use 12-point font.
- 6. Your retelling should last 4-5 minutes.
- 7. You may have a script in front of you, but make good eye contact.

^{*}I will give at least 3 days in class for working on these projects. One day will be spent in the library for research. The other two days will be for the purpose of typing/working independently on project.
